# Why get involved?

Roots for a wilder future will provide you with a programme of educational content tailored to your schools needs in relation to areas such as:

#### How will it work?

- 10-15 sessions at your school spread over an academic year (2-3 per half term) including a visit to a local green space each full term.

- Content is flexible to your schools priorities
- Session led by experienced GWT staff with Enhanced DBS
