Greystones Farm

Bourton-on-the-Water, GL54 2EN

Greystones provides a unique experience for school groups. This recently renovated centre features a dedicated education room, an education garden, working dairy farm and replica Iron Age roundhouse. The wildflower meadows, River Eye, woodland and hedgerows are home to a wide range of wildlife including otters, water voles, barn owls, woodpeckers, badgers and crayfish.

The history of Greystones stretches back 6,000 years to the Neolithic period, with strong links to the Iron Age.

Facilities

WILD DAYS OUT





Crickley Hill Birdlip, GL4 8JY

Just five miles away from Cheltenham town centre and covering 143 acres, Crickley is a perfect location for a school trip. This stunning nature reserve with outstanding views features ancient woodlands and meadows which provide wonderful habitats for minibeasts, birds and mammals.

Crickley has a rich history spanning 5,000 years and there is visible evidence of the Iron Age hill fort which your pupils can discover during one of our sessions.

Robinswood Hill

Gloucester, GL4 6SX

Located within the suburbs of Gloucester Robinswood Hill is a 100 hectare nature reserve right on your doorstep. It is a special place for nature and a fantastic place to experience wild learning with your class. With a large range of natural habitats from flower rich meadows to old orchards, Robinswood Hill is home to a variety of wildlife. It is also an important historical and geological site that is enjoyed by recreational visitors all year round.

Robinswood Hill is owned and managed by Gloucester City Council

HANDS - ON WORK-SHOPS

Minibeast Detectives EYFS and KS1 All sites

This workshop will take your pupils on a minibeast hunt of the site. Through tried and tested activities learners will explore the physical characteristics of invertebrates; how they are classified and adapted to suit the environment they are found in.

Depending on which site you are visiting and what time of the year, your session may involve dipping for minibeasts in a river or a pond, or you may concentrate on land-dwelling invertebrates.

Seasons and Senses EYFS and KS1 All sites

In this fun and hands-on workshop your pupils will be encouraged to use their senses to find out more about the natural world and how seasonal changes affects the wildlife living there. Through age appropriate games and activities, the class will go on a trail around the site to discover more about the roles of the senses in native species of wildlife and how important they are in their survival. They will investigate the structure of a variety of common animals and start to explore how they are suited for the environment that they live in.





Leafy Life EYFS and KS1 All sites

Through fun activities children explore how we identify trees, why trees are so important to us and what they need to survive. They will explore the different properties of different trees, what other life they support and how they are affected by seasonal change. This action-packed workshop also allows for time for your class to take part in structured woodland play, through den building and natural crafts.



Wild Animals and their Habitats

KS1 and KS2 Greystones

This is a unique opportunity to explore the scientific methodology of small mammal surveying with your class and importance of surveying by trapping in order to understand the health of the nature reserve and the ecosystem existing there. A workshop to remember; the class will set traps and see if they are able to catch any small mammals. They will explore the characteristics of anything caught; explore how it is suited to live in its environment and its position within the food chain.

Iron Age; Survival Now and Then

KS2 Greystones and Crickley Hill

Your class will explore how Iron Age people relied on natural materials to survive: expand their bushcraft skills and have a go at some Iron Age tasks, including, making grain into flour, lighting a fire and building a wall with wattle and daub. The workshop leader will explore the degree to which we rely on nature to survive today and key differences between the ways societies in the Stone Age to Iron Age and modern societies impact on the eco-system.





River Rangers KS2 Greystones Farm

This full day workshop allows pupils to immerse themselves in a river study of the River Eye. Your class will explore human impact on the river, search for evidence of riverbank dwelling mammals and use scientific field guides to identify the invertebrates they have found. Working scientifically, they will conduct a fly monitoring survey using kick sampling techniques to explore how habitats are being impacted upon by pollution.

Invertebrates and their Habitats

KS2 All Sites

Depending on which site you have booked to visit. and what time of year you are coming, your session may involve dipping for minibeasts in a river or a pond, or you may concentrate on land-dwelling invertebrates. You will compare the habitats of the invertebrates you find and explore the way that scientists use surveying techniques to better understand the state of insect numbers in the county. Activities are practical, handson and fun.

All workshops are ageappropriate, risk assessed and relate directly to the National Curri ulum.

FOREST SCHOOL

A Forest School is an innovative educational approach to outdoor play and learning. Forest Schools have demonstrated success with children of all ages who have the opportunity to learn about the natural environment, how to navigate risk and most importantly to use their own initiative to solve problems and co-operate with others. All activities are age appropriate and risk assessed..

Forest School Taster

Any age group

This session gives you and your pupils the chance to spend half a day in a wild space and to try out a Forest School activity. Choose from den making, natural art, whittling, tree climbing and natural scavenger hunts. We aim that you'll see benefits during and beyond the session.

Growing Skills

Any age group

We know that nature helps people feel more relaxed and can have a positive impact on mental wellbeing. Through accessible activities this workshop will use the natural world to give your pupils a chance to reconnect to the natural world, their peer group and create something to be proud of.



IN Your School

WILDLIFE QUIZ

Running for over 40 years, the Gloucestershire Wildlife Quiz is well known by primary schools throughout the county as an exciting way of engaging pupils in wildlife. Schools enthusiastically compete against each other in various heats for the title of the 'Wildlife Quiz School Champion'.

Last year over 400 students aged between 8 and 11 years old participated in the quiz, from nearly 100 Gloucestershire schools. Whilst matches usually take place in person at competing schools, in the interest of being COVID secure, in 2021 it is likely to take place over a series of video matches. Taking part is completely free of charge, and if you'd like more information please contact us.

The Wildlife Quiz is organised and delivered entirely by a group of dedicated volunteers and Gloucestershire Wildlife Trust is indebted to them for their passion and commitment to learning and wildlife.
